### Obsolete Filters for Adobe After Effects

#### What are BCC 3.0 Obsolete Filters?

Obsolete Filters are older versions of filters that you can edit or change in your existing projects and compositions, but can no longer apply as new filters.

BCC 3 obsolete filters allow previously applied BCC 2.0 effects to be adjusted, but remove the older BCC 2.0 filters from the After Effects Effect menu. This allows you to apply BCC 3.0 filters as new effects while preserving the opportunity to edit the older versions of these BCC filters.

#### Who can use BCC 3.0 Obsolete Filters?

BCC 3.0 Obsolete Filters are for BCC 2.x After Effects users only.

#### How do I install BCC 3.0 Obsolete Filters?



Make sure the older BCC 2 filters are still installed on your system. If you have uninstalled or removed them, reinstall them from the BCC 2.0 CD.

Download the BCC 3 Obsolete Filter installer. When you run the installer, the BCC 3 obsolete filters are placed into the same location as the BCC 2.x plug-ins were installed. After you install the BCC 3 obsolete filters, the older BCC 2.0 filters no longer display in the After Effects Effect menu.

#### How do I use the Obsolete Filters

After you install the BCC 3 Obsolete Filters, the older 2.x versions of BCC filters will not appear in the After Effects Effect menu, however if you have projects containing these older filters, you will be able to edit them-- the BCC 2.x filter controls will appear in the After Effects Controls window.

If you have installed BCC 3.x, these newer filters are the only versions of BCC that appear in AE's Effect menu after you install the BCC Obsolete Filters. When you apply a new filter in a composition, the updated BCC 3.x version will be applied.
